

## What is Cowboy Action Shooting?

Competitors use "Old West" style firearms such as single action revolvers, pistol caliber lever action rifles, and old time shotguns.

Ammunition uses cast lead bullets loaded with either smokeless or black powder to a maximum of 1000fps for pistols and 1400fps for rifles.

Each course of fire is a timed event consisting of multiple large steel targets at fairly close range. The scenarios can include situations based on anything from historical gunfights to a scene from a movie.

A good deal of emphasis is placed on what the shooter wears. While you may dress as plainly or as fancily as you wish, your costume should be of a style seen in the 1800's. Some folks put more effort into their costume than they do their shooting!

## VMV

Verdant Mountain Vigilantes is a **SASS** affiliated club located in scenic northeast Vermont. We are a group of ordinary folk that enjoy shooting guns mixed with an appreciation of the traditions of the Old West.

VMV matches typically involve shooting 10 scenarios over the course of two days, 5 scenarios per day. A scenario is a timed event shooting through and around props and usually consists of shooting:

- 2 revolvers, 5 rounds each
- lever action rifle, 10 rounds
- shotgun, 2-6 rounds
- Each miss adds 5 seconds to your score.

Awards are usually given out at the end of the match on Sunday

Although it is not required that shooters belong to SASS at our local level matches it is encouraged. State, Regional and National level matches require SASS membership.

**August** - 2nd weekend

**September** - 4th weekend
